





# Observatory for Children and Youth Rights in Albania (2009 – 2018)

Observatory for Children's Rights experience was introduced for the first time in the Albanian society in 2009, and it aims to function as a monitoring structure, based on local level, regarding the implementation and realization of children's rights, by acting and supporting as part of civil society. In 2018, Observatory's mission was extended by including also youth.





Good governance for children must also address the root causes of the lack of public sector responsiveness to children. The place to examine the quality of good governance from a children's perspective is in the points of contact between children and the state.



The data collection and monitoring process is complemented by open discussions, round tables, meetings and seminars with regional and national stakeholders in order to achieve a proper implementation of children's rights






### Data collection system – Dev Info








Figure 4: % of children living in families with unemployed people, 2011





Figure 5: Number of families with children and recipients of economic assistance, 2011



- -The regions which continue to have the same situation in year 2010 as in 2009 are Dibra and Shkodra.
- -The regions which have made **progress** in attendance are: Kukës with 9% increase. Korça with 19% and Vlora with 10%.
- -In 2010 the regions which have had the greatest attendance of pre-school institutions are Korça and Kukës.

### The right to education- compulsory education






The regions which have had a decrease in the attendance rate in compulsory education from 2009 to 2010 are: Dibra(10% decrease), Durrës(3% decrease), Shkodra(6% decrease), Vlora(3% decrease)

In 2010 in compulsory education in higher levels are Dibra and Kukës.

### The right to education- secondary education





The regions which have a **decrease** in attendance rate in secondary education from 2009 to 2010 are: Kukës (14% decrease), Korcë (11% decrease), Shkodër (9% decrease), (Vlorë 11% decrease).

In 2010 the regions which have greater levels of attendance rate in secondary education are Kukës. Dibra and Lezha.


*Note:* Related to high school attendance in Commune level, for year 2010, there is present the phenomena of changing the school even that the child leave in different area. This phenomena of changing school is reflected in calculation that we made present, which affect in direct way in the result made present and we could not measure the level of change.

If we see the ratio between the total number of families in regional level and number of families which are supported with economic aid and have children 0-15 years old, Shkodra, Elbasan, Korca and Lezha are in direct proportion. Kukes and Dibra in 2009 and 2010 are the regions which are in indirect proportion for these two indicators; which means that even though the total number of families is low compared to other regions, the number of families supported by EA is high.

Total number of families




Percentage of children 6-15 years old, 2010





Comparison of the number of affected families from the floods February 2015 vs October 2015


Comparison of the number of evacuated families from the floods February 2015 v.s October 2015





The number of affected families and the number of evacuated families in regional level




The number of affected families in commune level in the most affected communes


The percentage of passing pupils in the final MoES exam (subjects: foreign language, mother tongue language and math)




The difference in the grade taken from the final MoES exam and the grade taken during the academic year (9th grade)




## **Graph-1 (EA and Number of Families) Dibra Region**





Dibra Region has 201,702 inhabitants with 35 administrative units. The ratio between the families which are supported with EA (8,836) and families in total (49,362)is 19.7%







Durres Region has 414,065 inhabitants with 16 administrative units. The ratio between the families which are supported with EA (1,087) and families in total (102,283)is 1.06%






Korce Region has 363,190 inhabitants with 37 administrative units. The ratio between the families which are supported with EA (9,506) and families in total (102,177)is 7.4%








### Data on children's enrollment to school

## Take away messages



- Use national data from <u>up-down</u> and v.s <u>periodically</u>;
- A local authority responsible to coordinate data collection by <u>cross sectors</u> and report prepared;
- Cross sector indicators has to "speak" the same language regarding <u>indicator</u> for data collection;
- Visualize your data and make them <u>public</u>;

## Take away messages



- Link data with <u>political promises</u> and <u>citizens</u> <u>voice</u>;
- Data recording affect on better management in timing - quality of services – needs.
- Please! Do not forget to bring the voice of children throughout of these processes.
